

Denton County Lawyers Foundation Announces Grant Award

The non-profit Denton County Lawyers Foundation today announced that it has been awarded a grant in the amount of \$37,500 from the Texas Bar Foundation. The funds will be utilized to partially assist with startup costs for a new supervised visitation center. The DCLF is working with local government and other non-profits to establish a much needed program designed to strengthen families involved in the justice system for varying reasons.

Jasmin Dodson, president of the Denton County Bar Association, believes that Denton County is fortunate to have a local bar dedicated to serving the needs of underserved populations. The DCLF plans to establish a program that will be available on a sliding scale to families in need and hopes to begin scheduling supervised family visits in early 2023.

Since its inception in 1965, the Texas Bar Foundation has awarded more than \$24 million in grants to law-related programs. Supported by members of the State Bar of Texas, the Texas Bar Foundation is the nation's largest charitably-funded bar foundation.

Vicki Isaacks, president of The Denton County Lawyers Foundation points out that the Foundation is a non-profit entity dedicated to aiding educational projects, direct legal services projects, and charitable projects aimed at meeting the law related needs of the public and the profession and is grateful for the assistance of the Texas Bar Foundation in meeting these goals.
